Those of us who are baby boomers will remember when our homes had only one phone. It was black and sat on a telephone stand which was often in the hallway. There were no telemarketers, call waiting or caller id. In fact some of us had a party line which we shared to save on the phone bill. There were strict rules of etiquette, like no calls during dinner, keeping the call brief, only family calls on Sunday. Living in a house full of girls the ringing of the phone was accompanied by a chorus of "Is it for me?" Today we have cell phones, blackberries, iPhones, email and IM so that we don't miss that important message or call. But are we so busy we are missing the most important call of all?

God has chosen to touch and use each of us in different ways following our three day weekend. And each of us has responded to His call in our own way. There is no doubt that only a very small number, if any, leave the weekend unchanged. I doubt that any of us left camp and became a new person over night. For most the changes in our lives are gradual and then we look back and say **WOW** how my life has changed during my 4th days.

If we are focused and heed God's call, our lives follow the pattern of the weekend. We start out slowly and then build. First we become more active at our home church. Finding time we never thought we had to do little things. Reassessing our priorities and investing in what is really important to us. I remember my first time as fourth day help serving on the Agape Team. I was blown away at all of the activity behind the scenes. Only then did I begin to appreciate the sacrifices others had made for me. When I signed up for the prayer vigil I didn't know how I was going to pray for the pilgrims by name since I didn't even know who they were or what their needs were. But of course the Holy Spirit knew exactly what their needs were and responded to my prayer for inspiration.

So why not turn off the computer and the cell phone and the TV and listen for that most important call of all... and yes it's for you!

EMMAUS VIDEO CONFERENCING

My wife and I went for a short visit back to New York last month for my niece's wedding. We picked up the rental car at the Albany airport and started heading north. As we're driving along I looked at the gas stations and saw a price of \$4.29 per gallon for regular gas. So we called back home to our banker to see if we could get a small loan – just enough for a week's worth of driving.

The high cost of gas is causing your MWTE board of directors some concern as we start bringing together teams for the upcoming walks. Typically, people who agree to be on team are from different areas of the state. Minnesota is a big state and it gets hard to ask someone to be on a conference room or agape team when you know the financial sacrifice they will need to make.

Our team meetings are meant to bring people together in unity with God and with each other. Traditionally our meetings require each team member share the same physical space and time for the team formation process to occur. However, we need to be sensitive to people who may have to travel great distances to be a part of our teams.

With the advent of technology and telecommunications, conferences no longer require a shared physical space, but still require a coordinated time for participants to meet. We realize, however, that this is not the best way to foster the formation of new teams

We are looking into the possibility of using the Internet to overcome this concern. At present we are starting to look into the feasibility and requirements that will allow remote participation in team meetings. We'll be keeping the Emmaus Community apprised of our findings.

If you are willing to be a sponsor, please contact Michelle Schober at 763-425-0794 so we can start gathering a list of people who are willing to sponsor a pilgrim they have yet to meet.

Whether you are sponsoring someone whom you have yet to meet, or you wish to sponsor a friend, sponsorship is very easy; follow these simple steps:

- Pray for God's direction in whom to sponsor and for their openness.
- Discuss the retreat with your potential pilgrim. Share what the Walk to Emmaus meant to you.
- Give them a [registration form](#) and follow up. But never force anyone to go on a Walk to Emmaus!
- Get a copy of the [sponsor form](#) and fill it out.
- Submit the completed form(s) to the registrar as soon as possible.
- Continue in prayer for your pilgrim and get started on your [sponsorship responsibilities](#). On the Thursday evening of the walk, you bring your pilgrim to camp and help to get him or her settled, then stay for a short sponsor meeting once the pilgrims are led away to start their Walk. Then if you are able, you come to Candlelight on Saturday evening and share in that awesome experience. And of course, you may come back on Sunday for Closing and pick up your pilgrim.

Please consider sponsoring someone for the upcoming Walks. Please be a blessing to someone you know and sponsor their Walk to Emmaus. Bring your friend closer to Christ!

A Word from Our Community Spiritual Director

I feel like the convention speaker introduced as a Texan who made 100 million dollars from drilling for oil. The man said, "Thank you, but I have a few corrections. I'm from Pennsylvania, not Texas. I'm in coal, not oil. It was 100 thousand dollars not, 100 million. I lost it rather than made it." Then he paused and said, "And, it was my brother, not me."

I have a few corrections too. I'm not your Community Spiritual Director. The Rev. Paul Kobi is recovering from surgery. Your Immediate Past Community Spiritual Director, the Rev. Duane Sarazin is helping Paul with the approaching Walks, but suffered a health setback also and is not available to write... so you got me, their (spiritual) brother. (Paul and Duane appreciate your support in prayer.)

The Bible says, "In his heart a man plans his course, but the Lord determines his steps" (Proverbs 16:9). I think we experience a lot of unplanned things, but it can be difficult to believe that God determined our steps. However, sometimes it is easy to see.

It was so obvious at the Men's Walk last fall. I was privileged to work on the team, and a jolt of excitement shot through me when I heard the talks at a preparation session. I was awed by how important each person's personality was to their talk. It was so obvious that each person was a letter from heaven. God had put speaker and speech together.

During the Walk I looked around the conference room, and saw God dismantle our defenses. I saw our resistance to his life-changing grace evaporate. I witnessed the impact of those supporting us in prayer. I knew God was hearing and answering prayers. Workers and pilgrims were being saved, in the fullest sense of that word. Tears filled my eyes and dripped down my cheeks. The weekend was planned by humans, but it was divinely orchestrated. We need to continue to plan and believe that God will orchestrate his great work through us. However, the circumstances are often not so kind and the fruit not quickly visible. The Apostle Paul walked a divine path of triumph though he frequently suffered ailment, injury, opposition and mishap. Knowing the amazing, rewarding love of God, he focused on his assignment.

We also need to focus on our assignment. God has lifted you and me up, whatever the circumstances, to make a difference today. It requires faith. When the giant Goliath stood between Israel and victory, all Israel believed God could deliver them; however, only one person believed that God could deliver the nation through him. That is why David became God's champion.
